

MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE INTER - MINISTERIAL APPROVAL COMMITTEE (IMAC) CONSTITUTED UNDER THE SCHEME FOR INTEGRATED COLD CHAIN AND VALUE ADDITION INFRASTRUCTURE HELD ON 27.02.2017

In continuation of IMAC meeting held on 22.02.2017, a meeting of the Inter-Ministerial Approval Committee (IMAC) constituted under the Scheme of Integrated Cold Chain and Value Addition Infrastructure was held under the Chairpersonship of Hon'ble Minister, FPI on 27.02.2017 to consider the proposals received against the EOI dated 31.08.2016 for grant of financial assistance. The list of participants is at **Annexure-I.**

2. Smt. Anuradha Prasad, Joint Secretary & Convener of IMAC welcomed the Hon'ble Minister and other members of the Committee. IMAC considered 50 proposals pertaining to fish/meat/marine/poultry/irradiation sector from states of AP, Odisha, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Kerala, West Bengal, Haryana, Mizoram, Arunachal Pradesh, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Telangana, UP, Tamilnadu, Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh, Gujarat, Punjab and reviewed the recommendations made by the Technical Committee against each proposal.

3. Based on the deliberations, IMAC approved 19 proposals as eligible. Details of the eligible proposals along with grant calculation is at **Annexure-II.** IMAC rejected 29 proposals as in-eligible as per **Annexure-III.** The proposals of M/s Ananda Enterprises (India) Pvt. Ltd., Andhra Pradesh and M/s Devi Sea Foods Ltd., Andhra Pradesh approved by TC were deferred by IMAC on the ground that the applicants are the promoters of mega food park projects which are still under implementation. It was decided to ascertain their eligibility first based on the

guidelines of the Scheme for Integrated Cold Chain and Value Addition Infrastructure. Details are at **Annexure-IV**.

4. IMAC reiterated the direction to review the methodology for scoring against the criterion relating to availability of raw material and decided that an agenda for this criterion and also for scoring against the criterion relating to proposed investment in cold chain components may be placed in the next meeting.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair and all present.
