

MOFPI INDUSTRIAL ADVICE CADRE TRAINING PLAN
LEVEL-B TRAINING PROGRAMME

DATE : 24.07.2026

1. Background

The Department of Personnel & Training (DoP&T), Government of India, issued the **National Training Policy, 2012** vide O.M. No. 12021/8/2011-Trg.I dated 19 January 2012 and O.M. dated 4 July 2012. In accordance with the policy, every Cadre Controlling Authority (CCA)/Ministry/Department is required to develop a **Cadre Training Plan (CTP)** for its respective cadres which serves as a comprehensive framework for continuous professional development of employees. It identifies the competencies required at different stages of service and incorporates appropriate training interventions to equip officers with the knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary to discharge their responsibilities effectively throughout their careers—from induction to retirement.

2. Level B Training Programme

The Level B Training Programme is a Mandatory Training Programme for Technical Officers for Promotion to the Post of Assistant Industrial Adviser (Level-10) in the Industrial Advice Cadre.

3. Main Features

- i. The duration of the training shall be 2 weeks.
- ii. Programme Co-ordinator will be DS/Dir(Admin).

4. Programme Methodology

The training programme shall be conducted by the Ministry of Food Processing Industries, either directly or in association with such Government training institution(s), autonomous bodies, public sector undertakings, academic institutions or other organizations as may be considered appropriate by the Ministry from time to time.

The training programme shall broadly cover the following areas:

- (i) Organizational structure, mandate and functioning of the Ministry of Food Processing Industries;
- (ii) Industrial Adviser Cadre and role/duty of Technical Officers;
- (iii) Food processing technologies and infrastructure;
- (iv) Food safety, quality assurance and food testing systems;
- (v) Major schemes and programmes of the Ministry;
- (vi) Exposure visits to food processing industries, research and development institutions, food testing laboratories, incubation centres, and other facilities supported under the Ministry's schemes, and;
- (vii) Any other subject considered relevant by the Ministry.

5. Exemption, Deferment and Re-nomination for Training



(i) Ordinarily, officer nominated for the Mandatory Training Programme shall not be exempted from undergoing the training.

(ii) The Competent Authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing and in exceptional circumstances such as medical grounds, election duty, court duty, training overlap, or other unavoidable personal exigencies, permit deferment of the training programme.

(iii) Such deferment shall ordinarily be granted only once during the service of the officer in respect of the prescribed training.

(iv) An officer who is unable to complete the training programme or fails to meet the prescribed requirements for successful completion shall be nominated for the next available training programme.

(v) No officer shall ordinarily be provided more than two opportunities to successfully complete the prescribed training programme.

(vi) Failure to successfully complete the training programme within the permitted opportunities may result in withholding of confirmation, promotion or other service benefits linked to successful completion of the training, in accordance with the applicable Recruitment Rules and Government instructions.

Presentation	50%

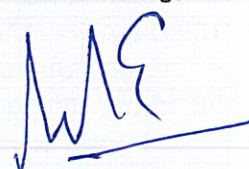
8. Certificate
